

BRIDGING EXAMINATIONS AVAILABLE TO/FROM CSWIP

1. AWS

1.1 AWS to CSWIP Welding Inspector

Needs to be a current AWS Certified Welding Inspector and sit an examination consisting of:

- Theory paper: 80 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 120 minutes
- Practical paper: eight examination specimens, 24 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 90 minutes.

NOTE: A one-day bridging course is recommended.

2. BGAS

2.2 BGAS-CSWIP Welding Inspector to CSWIP Welding Inspector

Needs to have held the BGAS Welding Inspector qualification for three years and sit an examination consisting of:

- Theory paper: 80 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 120 minutes
- Practical paper: eight examination specimens, 24 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 90 minutes.

NOTE: A CSWIP Welding Inspector Course or a suitable bridging course* is recommended.

2.3 CSWIP Welding Inspector to BGAS-CSWIP Welding Inspector

Needs to have held the CSWIP Welding Inspector qualification for one year and sit an examination consisting of:

- Theory paper: 30 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 45 minutes
- Practical paper: 30 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 45 minutes

NOTE: A BGAS-CSWIP Welding Inspector Course or a suitable bridging course* is recommended.

3. WTIA (Australia)

3.1 WTIA Welding Inspector to CSWIP Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a current WTIA Welding Inspector qualification and sit an examination consisting of:

- Theory paper: 80 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 120 minutes
- Practical paper: eight examination specimens, 24 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 90 minutes.

NOTE: A one-day bridging course is recommended.

4. SAIW (South Africa)

4.1 SAIW Welding Fabricator Inspector Level 1 to CSWIP Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a current SAIW Welding/Fabricator Inspector Level 1 and sit an examination consisting of:

- Theory paper: 80 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 120 minutes
- Practical paper: eight examination specimens, 24 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 90 minutes.

NOTE: A one-day bridging course is recommended.

4.2 SAIW Welding Fabricator Inspector Level 2 to CSWIP Senior Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a current SAIW Welding/Fabricator Inspector Level 2 and sit an examination consisting of:

- General paper: 30 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 45 minutes.
- Scrutinise a technical drawing and answer 10 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 30 minutes
- Scrutinise and comment on four NDT inspection related documents and answer 40 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 75 minutes.
- TWI Specification: 60 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 150 minutes.

NOTE: It is recommended that a two-day pre-exam course is completed.

5. VT-W2

5.1 DUTCH VT-W2 to CSWIP 3.1 Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a valid CWV2 and sit the full CSWIP 3.1 examination.

NOTE: A two-day bridging course is recommended.

6. Canadian Welding Bureau

6.1 Canadian Welding Inspector Level 1 to CSWIP Visual Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a current CWB Welding Inspector Level 1 and sit an examination consisting of:

- Practical paper: eight examination specimens, 24 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 90 minutes.

6.2 Canadian Welding Inspector Level 2 to CSWIP Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a current CWB Welding Inspector Level 2 and sit an examination consisting of:

- Theory paper: 80 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 120 minutes
- Practical paper: eight examination specimens, 24 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 90 minutes.

6.3 Canadian Welding Inspector Level 3 to CSWIP Senior Welding Inspector

Needs to hold a current CWB Welding Inspector Level 3 and sit an examination consisting of:

- General paper: 30 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 45 minutes.
- Scrutinise a technical drawing and answer 10 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 30 minutes
- Scrutinise and comment on four NDT inspection related documents and answer 40 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 75 minutes.
- TWI Specification: 60 multiple choice questions. Time allowed: 150 minutes.

NOTE: It is recommended that a two-day pre-exam course is completed.
